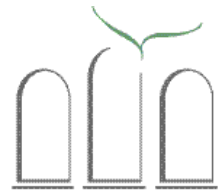

SEARCH TEAM UPDATE

The pastor Search Team is excited to be entering the candidate phase of the search process. This work reflects a tremendous amount of progress and the preparation allows us to now move into the candidate phase with strong organization and a refined view of the person we are looking to fill this position.

IET (INTERIM EXECUTIVE TEAM) UPDATE

In September 2010 the Council of Elders authorized a sub-committee titled the Vision Assessment Team (VAT). The members of this team included two Elders, Dick Wolden (chair) and Dana Chase, and three other volunteers, Becky Davis, Bill Mullen and Terri Goehner.

The VAT charter was to evaluate our progress against our last five-year plan (2004 – 2009) and consider ways to monitor performance of the next five-year plan. The VAT reported their findings and recommendations to Council of Elders on February 14, 2011. Their presentation included some of the following:

The successes of the 2004 – 2009 five-year plan identified by the VAT based on input from the Congregation included:

- Making the Sanctuary more classically attractive and modern in function;
- Building an understanding of the significance of baptism and in declaring our relationship with Christ;
- Developed a more Christ-centered worship service;
- Emphasized that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is shared in many different venues;
- Encouraging our members to glorify God through their time, treasure and talent;
- Becoming a church of prayer; and
- Becoming a warm & welcoming church.

Areas where the Congregation felt progress was not as hoped:

- Expand to more than one ministry site;
- Communicating the vision & plan over the 5 years;
- Instructing and equipping our members to evangelize & facilitate the maturity of our members;
- Increasing relationships between young and old;
- Providing leadership for the community of Christian seniors;
- Leading by the Council of Elders, Senior Pastor and Staff; and
- Providing continued leadership for the community of Christian singles.

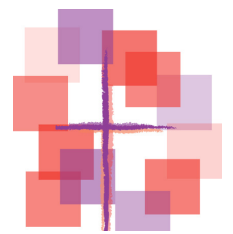
The VAT made several very good recommendations to the Council of Elders:

- Establish a sub-committee of the Elders to provide oversight of progress to fulfilling the Church Mission and Vision;
- Continue to develop a closer relationship between Elders and Staff;
- Set clear expectation of Ministry contributions supporting the Vision Plan and Church Mission;
- Communicate progress regularly to the Congregation; and
- Celebrate successes.

The members of the VAT invested many hours to this work which produced valuable evaluations and recommendations. The product of this team will be utilized by the Council of Elders and Staff over the next several years. You should expect to see many of their ideas put to good use. Please thank the members of this team for their gifts of time and talent when you see them.

“THE FAMILY TABLE”

I have great childhood memories of growing up in Glendale, California. A highlight for me was going to my grandparent’s house for family dinners. I remember my silly uncles who were always telling jokes, my grandfather who was ready to help with a project, my grandmother who led the music and my cousins who supplied the entertainment. When dinner time came, we all sat down at different tables - the adults at the “adult table” and the kids at the “kids table.” The kids table was chaos. I don’t think we really ate anything, and we were left to our own mischief. The adults had their adult conversations and the kids were not allowed.

I was reminded of the adult and the kids tables recently when Kara Powell came to speak. She talked about the practice of the church in recent history to send the children and youth to the “kids table” or the children/youth area of the church and the adults to the Sanctuary. What has that done to help children and youth feel part of the church? Not much. According to the latest research by the Fuller Youth Institute, at least 50% of students who graduate from high school graduate from their faith at the same time. What a discouraging statistic! How can we change this? Is there anything we can do as a church? I believe the answer is Yes.

In February, Debbie Sturm, Sally Bryant, Michele Ruby, Jeannie Hilt and I traveled to Fuller Seminary to meet with 15 other churches, from around the United States, to look at the latest research about children, youth and their families. It was very encouraging to be with other churches who were asking the same questions we have been asking at SFC. As we listened to the latest research, we had several ideas but we are still in process. Here are some interesting facts from the Fuller Youth Institute’s latest research (College Transition Project) that lead to a “sticky life-long faith”:

- Parents are still the number one influence in their child’s spiritual life.
- Children and youth need 5 adult mentors in their life to encourage, equip and love them. It does take a village. We all need to love every child, not just our own.
- The more students serve and build relationships with younger children the more likely it is their faith will stick.

FROM OUR PASTORS

- Participation in all-church worship during high school is more consistently linked with mature faith in both high school and college than any other form of church or youth group participation.

Did you catch that last statistic? Children and youth have a better chance to develop a life-long faith when they worship together with the entire church. They have a better chance to develop a life-long faith when they understand they are part of the whole intergenerational church. They have a better chance to have a life-long faith when the “adult table” at church becomes the “family table.” We will have a better chance of developing life-long disciples if we figure out how we can be a truly intergenerational church. 2010 LENTEN OFFERING

Each year we take a collection during Lent – the weeks between Ash Wednesday (March 9) and Easter (April 24). This year’s goal of \$40,000 will be split equally between the two recipients chosen by the Local and Global Outreach Teams. Please give as you are able and designate your gift to the Lenten offering by writing “Lenten Offering” on your check or offering envelope. Thank you in advance for your continued generosity.

Global Outreach: Child Hope International

Silas and Bhakti Khadka were moved by the dire plight of orphaned/abandoned children to start Child Hope International (CHI) over 14 years ago in Nepal. Because of CHI, many children have been rescued from a life of hopelessness and given a loving Christian home, an education, medical care and are prepared to become active and productive members of society as well as disciplined Christian believers. Today, CHI has twenty homes serving over 150 boys and girls, but many more homes are needed.

The money from the Lenten offering will help CHI start and fund two new homes, parented by previous generation CHI children, for two years at a cost of \$16,400. These loving Christian homes will care for 10 children, providing food, clothing, school uniforms, school tuition and supplies and medical care. The additional \$3,600 will provide a nursing school scholarship for a deserving young woman raised in a CHI home. Nurses are in great demand in Nepal. This gift will enable a well-trained Christian nurse to serve in a remote part of Nepal.

Local Outreach: Advent Group Ministries

Advent Group Ministries serves youth with histories of addiction, abuse, neglect, gang involvement and chaotic family lives. Advent Ministries desires that every child hears the Gospel in a way they can understand and experiences the love of Christ through healthy relationships. Their programs strive to meet the teens’ spiritual needs while offering high-quality individualized treatment for complex mental health and addiction issues.

More than six years ago, Saratoga Federated Church donated a new passenger van. After six years of heavy use, it has worn out. Because transportation plays such a vital role in Advent’s treatment program, it is crucial that they have safe, reliable vans they can count on. The money (\$20,000) from the Lenten offering will help purchase a new (or slightly used) passenger van to “put wheels” on this highly successful treatment program for troubled and addicted teens.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

The Elders are pleased to bring you this update on the church’s progress toward its annual fiscal goals. Our fiscal year runs from July 1 to June 30. We are in the 10th month of the current fiscal year. At the beginning of the fiscal year we adopted what we hoped was a conservative operating budget targeting General Fund giving of \$2,100,000, and slightly less spending. We also identified a series of priorities (a stretch budget) that we would address if giving exceeded that target.

Due to faithful giving throughout this year and some exceptionally generous gifts in late December we are able to address many of the priorities identified in the stretch budget. Thank you to everyone who gave or contributed through prayer to this outcome. General Fund giving through the end of February 2011 totaled \$1,866,677. If giving continues on the same trend as prior years we should be able to record approximately \$2,500,000 in receipts by June 30.

The Elders have agreed on an allocation of the projected \$400,000 one-time surplus. This allocation is consistent with previous communications and addresses the following priorities:

1. Restore the church deficit from previous years and begin building a positive reserve.
2. Begin restoring the retirement contribution for eligible full-time employees, which was suspended for 16 months from March 2009 through June 2010.
3. Provide a one-time compensation payment, equal to approximately 3% of salary, for all eligible employees.
4. Enable investment in a few deferred maintenance projects that would improve the safety and hospitality of our campus.

The first item above is essentially setting aside money to restore and begin building a prudent reserve. The amount allocated to this item is \$300,000. The remaining \$100,000 is going to the other three items. None of these items will cause our ongoing spending rate to increase. We are extremely thankful for the broad support the congregation has shown during this interim period while we work through this season of change.

May 15 will be a great day at SFC - Save the Date!



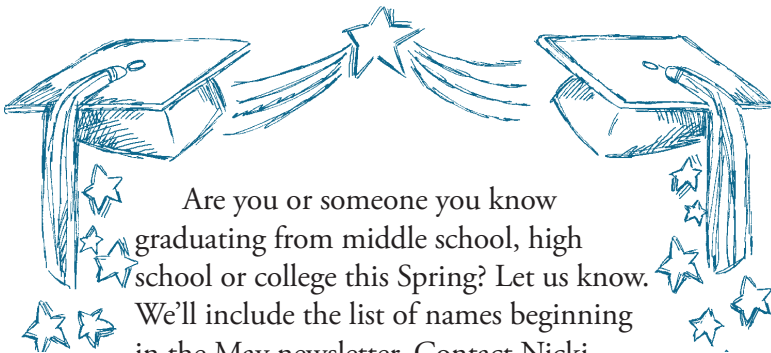

PRAYER AND EASTER

Prayer and the triduum of Easter (Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Resurrection Sunday) seem inextricably linked in my mind. In John 17, we read the "High Priestly Prayer" of Jesus, where just before his imminent betrayal, arrest, scourging, and crucifixion, Jesus prays for himself, his disciples, and all believers. This is followed almost immediately by Jesus' prayer in the Garden, where he beseeches his Father that "this cup be taken from" him, and at the same time, accepts his Father's will (Matthew 26:36-44).

Prayer is both an action and a state of being. We pray; that is an action. We seek to hear God's voice in prayer; that is a state of being. While often my most fervent prayers have been short ("HELP ME!"), I am trying to move away from the more reactive prayer practices of "life happens, I'd better pray." Rather, I want to live in prayer; I pray in order to move into an ever-deeper relationship with Him, rather than to get something done. I want God's perspective on all of life. This requires intentional time for prayer, not just quick prayers to begin and end my days, or between meetings. We must set aside time for prayer with our Creator and Redeemer; we must listen to God as well as pour out our heart to our loving Father.

We know that God's will is for each believer to be transformed into the image of Christ (Romans 8:29; 2 Corinthians 3:18). In prayer, the process of transformation happens as we respond to God's dreams for us and his church. We ask the Holy Spirit to shape our prayers according to the will of God.
