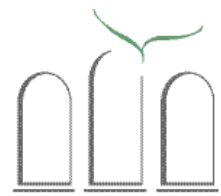

## FROM THE INSIDE OUT: 2010-2015

We earnestly desire to become so alive to God that our presence in the world will be credible and attractive to others seeking a faith family. When enough of us are being transformed, our congregation will be seen as a place where God is known and people grow. Our theme verse promises this outcome:

*“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!”*

2 Corinthians 5:17

Our current vision, introduced last fall, focuses on seven vision values: Spirit-Filled Community, Authentic Community, Joyful Community Service, Reflecting Our Neighborhood, Intergenerational Faith Family, Interpersonal Transparency and Active and Creative Evangelism. We have now completed the first year of this five year cycle, and offer a high-level review of progress the made in each area this last year:

***Spirit-Filled Community:*** Our preaching theme in February focused on the role of the Holy Spirit, and God’s active role in our becoming a spirit-filled community. This was a focus of the high school group as well. Small group studies focused on the person and work of the Spirit. We increased our focus on prayer together through our bi-monthly prayer times; Lenten lectio divina; and a half-day prayer retreat for elders, nominating committee, LMAT and senior staff; and monthly prayer focus for junior high and high school students on Sunday mornings as well as specially created prayer exercises for the high school and Confirmation classes.

***Authentic Community:*** Our preaching theme in October and November focused on biblical aspects of authentic community through an expositional series on Ephesians. We enjoyed fellowship together as a church family at the annual Lent Soup Supper and Federated Family Festival. Monthly name tags encouraged all of us to get to know each other better by “putting a name with a face.”

***Joyful Community Service:*** Our Community Service Day in November brought together 300 people working on 23 projects designed to show the love of God to our community. We hosted the weekly CSIX job networking group, and offered life enrichment series.

### FROM OUR PASTORS

***Reflect Our Neighborhood:*** We worked with Saratoga High School students to include a drum line for the Christmas in Saratoga event, which featured our neighborhood and drew in many of our neighbors.

***Intergenerational Faith Family:*** Our preaching theme in May and June focused on what it means to be an intergenerational faith family and included testimonies from three generations. We consistently provided childcare for church events. The Kids Choir has blessed our worship on several Sundays. We have joined the Fuller Youth Institute Sticky Faith cohort. We enjoyed a Family Game Night last summer. Our annual Mexico house-building trip is a great example of an intergenerational faith family. Christmas and Easter musicals featured intergenerational involvement from infants to seniors and all ages in between!

***Interpersonal Transparency:*** Our preaching theme in July and August will feature stories of personal growth by those within our congregation. The Women’s Recovery group and Men’s Honesty group continue to meet regularly.

***Active and Creative Evangelism:*** We’ve offered specially designed musical events specifically targeted at reaching our unchurched neighbors, as well as special-interest small groups focused on bicycle riding and crafts.

It’s a good start! Each of these vision values, experienced together, will transform us, our church, and many in our community. Please prayerfully ponder the ways in which God is calling you to participate.

## NEWS FROM OUR ELDER COUNCIL

In July 2010 the Council of Elders authorized a Leadership Model Assessment Team (LMAT) to evaluate the success and limitations of present and past SFC leadership models. A candid assessment was made of all church bodies and individual roles with significant leadership responsibility. The LMAT presented their final evaluations and recommendations to the Council on December 13, 2011. Other discoveries and recommendations about our leadership culture were received from the Church Assessment Team (CAT), Vision Assessment Team (VAT), Senior Staff and others. All significant insights and practical concerns must be considered, and some implemented.

To move forward the Council authorized a Leadership Model Development Team (LMDT) to design improvements to our structures, roles and processes, based on this very significant input. The LMAT provided a plan for implementation of their recommendations. It is stated in this plan that "to successfully implement a new Leadership Model, the Elders must be prepared to lead implementation." The LMDT will serve as a steering committee for these activities.

The LMDT is appointed by and works under the authority of the Council of Elders. This team will make recommendations to the Council and keep the Council informed on a regular basis of its activities and progress. This team consist of five members: Christie White (Chair), Carl Agers, Debbie Lillo, Jerry Bruce and Sally Bryant. They will be authorized for a period of one year at which time it can be reauthorized or reformed at the discretion of the Council of Elders.

This team will review all available reports and recommendations of previous assessment teams, with particular attention to recommendations received since November 2010. They will prioritize their work so as to support the ongoing pastoral search process.

The LMDT may utilize the experience and talents of lay leaders and staff members either as special topic consultants or on special project sub-teams to assist in this work. Any consultant or sub-team with an independent assignment will be given a written charter that states the background, purpose, scope of work and desired product.

The LMDT will generate draft charters for each major leadership team and all key lay leadership roles. Interaction with the Council will be pursued at each major fork in the road, and related decisions will be carefully sequenced. It is understood that every product is a draft subject to the review and refinement of the Council. The members of this team include: Please be in prayer for this team as they pursue their objectives.



## PASTORAL SEARCH TEAM UPDATE

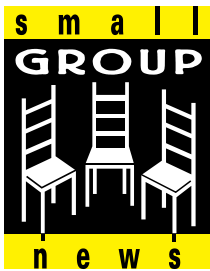
We have received about 20 prospective candidates from the congregation. Based on the Search Team's initial evaluation of these candidates, they are high quality, high caliber candidates. Over the next several weeks, we will be visiting the churches of prospective candidates to perform more in-depth assessments. These assessments will help us determine who to invite into further conversation.

We have engaged a Search Consultant to assist us in the process. As an independent, interdenominational church we don't receive help from any denominational headquarter. SFC has a history of using Search Consulting assistance to help us in developing candidate pools, reference checking, testing, background checks and so forth. This assistance will help to speed the process.

When do we expect to have our Teaching Pastor installed? While in God's hands, there are some practical considerations that will drive placement and arrival of our new pastor. With that in mind, the earliest we could have a new pastor in-place would be this fall. More likely, it will be after January 2012.

It seems like just yesterday...and its summer again!

### *Summer studies including youth*

If you are in a small group and you meet through the summer, consider including your children. Recently I spoke with Amy Sells after service on Sunday and she expressed that her group is interested in including the children this summer even if it is only during the group prayer time. What a great way to teach the importance of prayer to your children! If you are not in a small group, consider leading a group for a short time this summer that includes your children, your neighbors and friends. Kathy Kroesche sent me this recently about their family activity last summer: *"We decided to lead a group for Young Life over the summer. Our girls, going in the 4<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>, YL board member kids and other kids we know as friends joined us in this study. The kids decided to sell cookies to raise money to help International Justice Mission (IJM) and a 6<sup>th</sup> grader with cancer named Alex Solis. We tried to focus our group on Young Life high school students, and had parents, younger kids, and college-aged kids as well. It was an excellent community time."* She added, *"It was the highlight of our summer. These kids contributed as much thoughtful reflection as the adults and probably took in so much more."* Kathy recommends the

### *Adopt a Duffel*

Saratoga Federated Church is collaborating with Menlo Park Presbyterian Church as they have for many years to send interdenominational medical teams to Ethiopia. This year SFC is taking responsibilities that include recruiting volunteers, fund raising, transportation, and supplies. The Project Mercy trip to Yetebon and Butajira in Ethiopia is scheduled for October 22 to November 6, 2011. Our team must purchase and fill fifty duffel bags with medical supplies at a cost of \$300 per duffel. 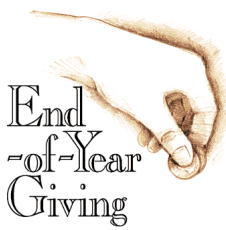

## FAITH AND THE ZIP LINE TOUR ONE ELDER'S EXPERIENCE BY DICK WOLDEN

Earlier this year, my wife and I spent ten days on the beautiful island of Kauai. Our visit to this lush green and thinly populated island was marked by restful days in the surf, sand and sun along with more challenging times of trying to make par at one of the local golf courses. Our days were filled with awe and wonder as we soaked up the beauty and majesty of our Lord's creation.

On one of our days on the island, we took advantage of a zip line tour, which consists of a cable stretched between two points at different elevations. Each participant wears a harness that is hooked onto a pulley which is secured onto a cable. The experience begins as the participant steps off the initial platform and lets his momentum zip or carry him along to the next platform. One of the well-trained guides positions himself at the end of each zip line in order to slow the momentum of each incoming participant, providing a safe and secure landing.

In a similar way, our Father in Heaven wants us to experience a safe and secure landing as we learn to trust and follow him on a moment by moment basis. At times, he may ask us to step into his will without our fully understanding the implications of that decision much like that first step of trusting the cable on the zip line tour. In that moment of indecision on whether to follow him or not, we are reminded that he does not give us a spirit of fear, but of power, love and self-control. (1 Timothy 1:7)

We are reminded that we have our own trustworthy guide in the person of Jesus Christ who enables us to experience the love and fellowship of our Father through the work that he did on the cross. So, let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us and keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith. (Hebrews 12:1, 2)
