1. Who has had the greatest influence in your life as a Christian?
2. How did your mentors influence you? What specific actions of your mentors have helped you grow in your relationship with Christ?
3. In what ways will your willingness to teach your children and others (Deuteronomy 6:6b) be an expression of your obedience to: 1) the command to love God? 2) the command to love your neighbor? In what ways do you need to improve in this matter? List some specific plans of action.
4. Love for God was to be passed on from generation to generation. What attitudes have you picked up toward God from your parents and other mentors in your life? (If you are a parent, consider as well what attitudes toward God you are passing on to your children.)
- 65 Consider your own motivations. In what areas do you live by God's law out of obligation, and in what ways do you follow God's law because of your affection for him?
6. The Israelites were to be careful not to take God's gift of the new land for granted. What do you tend to take for granted about God's saving work in your life?
7. According to research, intergenerational relationships are the key to building lasting faith in children and teens. Do you believe that to be true? Did adults impact you in your own faith development? How have you been able to articulate faith to your own children? How do you think the church can do a better job in creating and maintaining intergenerational relationships?
